

## **Mobility**

The new Campus is located on the socalled "Bildungscampus". Address: Bildungscampus 2 and 9, 74076 Heilbronn.

There are a number of public transport stops around the Bildungscampus - and Heilbronn's central train station can also be reached by bike in 7 minutes or on foot in 15 minutes.

You can find all possible options (car, train, bus) on how to get to the Campus here:

### CampusRad

Bike-sharing with CampusRad is the smart, environmentally-friendly way to ride through the city.

- To be able to use the offer, students and staff of the Bildungscampus and Campus Sontheim must download the Call a Bike app:
- Then you must register once and free of charge with our cooperation partner Deutsche Bahn, the one-time registration can be done with the action code: CaB\_Campus\_Heilbronn and the campus ID. Your registration will be confirmed by entering the email/



SMS code sent to you. This is valid for 24 hours.

 Scan QR code on the bike and start cycling!

The bikes can be rented and returned at these four locations:

- Bildungscampus Ost (below the campus bridge)
- Car park Experimenta (on the ground floor, next to the ticket office)
- Student residence W27 (Wilhelmstraße 27, Parking courtyard)
- Campus Sontheim (at the main entrance Max-Planck-Straße)

The BikeBoxes on the Bildungscampus offer a safe and weather-protected place to store your bicycle and charge your e-bike at the same time.

For removable batteries, you will also find the AkkuBoxes with storage and charging facilities.

Both types of boxes can be rented for 1 euro per day. Charging your e-bike or battery is included in the fee.

### E-scooters & E-bikes

E-scooters have been available in the city of Heilbronn since 2020 and offer a viable alternative for covering shorter distances in a climate-friendly way. To use this mobility service, the Dott App (previously TIER) must be downloaded and an account must be created.

Since the end of 2022, this provider also offers e-bikes in Heilbronn. There are currently around 600 e-scooters and 300 bicycles available in the city. More information can be found on the city's website:

## Parking at TUM Campus Heilbronn

Starting in September 2021, students and employees will be able to use parking facilities at reduced rates, depending on the parking area. As usual, entry and exit is possible via the CampusCard.

### **ZEAG Carsharing**

The associated electric cars can be picked up, recharged, and returned on the first floor of the car parks Mitte and Ost of the Bildungscampus.

## University e-Library TUM eAccess

LIV (Learn – Inform - Connect) is the joint library of Hochschule Heilbronn (HHN), the Duale Hochschule Baden-Württemberg (DHBW) and Technical University of Munich (TUM). As a TUM student at the Campus Heilbronn, you have access to the complete literature inventory of LIV. The offers and services of the library are mostly free of charge via your CampusCard. In order to use the LIV, you must register in person at the library's information desk.

eAccess is a convenient way to use the electronic media under license at the TUM University Library. This includes electronic e-journals, e-books and databases. Your eAccess is web-based and requires no plug-ins, client software or special browser settings.

### **Language Courses**

You have different possibilities to learn German. We strongly recommend all non-native German speakers to improve their language skills in German. You can attend a course at **aim academy** on Bildungscampus:

## My Bildungscampus App

The "My Bildungscampus" app is now available: The new app for the Heilbronn campus can be downloaded free of charge and without registering from the iOS (Apple App Store) and Android (Google Play Store) stores. It contains relevant information on important topics such as parking garage occupancy, public transportation, media offerings and much more.

In real time, the app keeps students and employees up to date at all times, e.g. about the departure times of public transport around campus. If you are in need of a parking space, you can find out which parking garage has free spaces. You can use the CampusCard with the app 24 hours a day and anywhere.

The LIV library even allows you to search for suitable literature in the media stock via the app.

## CampusCard & TUM Student Card

Please note that you will receive two student ID cards: the TUM Student Card and the CampusCard. You need both cards, because they have different functions.

As a student of TUM Campus Heilbronn, you will receive the TUM Student Card for all student services at the TU Munich and for services offered by the Munich Student Union as well as outside the University. You will also need the Student Card, for example, for student discounts on admission to museums, theaters, swimming pools and other facilities, for subscriptions to newspapers and magazines, etc. You will receive the TUM Student Card directly from Munich by mail, if you are completely enrolled and have entered a German address in TUMonline.

Your CampusCard has other functions: you can use it to pay in the cafeteria, at the café, at the vending machines and in some residence halls. It is also used to pay parking fees and for access to the LIV library (including book lending). The CampusCard is valid only for Bildungscampus Heilbronn. To receive the card, you must be completely enrolled. Then you will receive an email with the link where you can start your registration.

You will get your TUM-ID from the LRZ (Leibniz Rechenzentrum) as soon as you are enrolled at TUM.

### **Printers on campus**

The students' printers are located in Building 2, on the second floor in room 2.06 (don't forget to validate your CampusCard at the entrance of the building to open the door), and in Building 9, on the first floor in the workplace at the sitting area. You can print up to 15 pages per day for free if you log in with your TUM-ID.

### **Health insurance**

Anyone who wants to study in Germany needs health insurance. Proof of insurance must be provided at the time of enrollment. There are two types of health insurance in Germany: public and private. Please check the differences between the two, because once you are privately insured, you can no longer switch to statutory health insurance during your studies.

### **Family doctor**

Once you are settled in Heilbronn it is convenient to look for a family doctor. Doctors in Germany are independent professionals, and you must be admitted in their list of patients to be able to go to their medical office. For more information, contact the Service Point.

In case you have an emergency in Germany, remember that you can always dial the following numbers:

110 Police or 112 Ambulance/Fire Department.

Please note that you should use ambulance services only for life-threatening situations like unconsciousness, respiratory arrest, heart problems, seizures or severe bleeding. In any case it is included in your health insurance and you can make use of this service.

**Dial 116117 for Medical Help** in the evening, on weekends and public holidays:

The medical on-call service (only in German) is helpful when these three conditions are met:

- Doctor's practices are closed
- You need medical help today
- The situation is not life-threatening

If a situation is **life-threatening** or there is a risk of permanent injury, please call **the** emergency number 112.

They will also help you find English-speaking medical practices where you can make an appointment during normal opening hours. And they offer support in eight other languages, in addition to English and German.

### **Broadcasting Fee**

After you registered in Heilbronn, you will automatically receive a letter requesting you to pay a mandatory fee of € 18.36 for using the public broadcasting service (GEZ), even if you don't own a television. In a shared apartment the fee has to be paid only once and not per person. Here you can find further information:

### **TUM Living**

This portal is exclusively for TUM members (student, alumni, employee, professor or similar). You can directly login with your personal TUM ID and find listings. Registered owners list their properties for rent here. Offers are verified before publication to ensure they are for real properties, though TUM does not own them.

### **Liability insurance**

Liability insurance is not mandatory in Germany but highly recommended and more and more student residences are requesting it.

Liability insurance in Germany protects you in case of unintentional damage to a person or entity or their belongings. In Germany it is very normal that in case of damage or accident, you are sued and the expenses are high.

If you already have a personal liability insurance in your home country, you should check whether it covers your long-term stay in Germany.



### **Recycling in Heilbronn**

Recycling has become a fundamental practice in modern society, as it contributes significantly to environmental conservation and the care of our natural resources.

In the city of Heilbronn, containers are provided for the following types of waste: residual waste, organic waste, waste paper/cardboard, and light-weight packaging. Bins for residual and organic waste require registration and incur charges. In contrast, using bins for waste paper/cardboard and light-weight packaging is voluntary and free of charge.

Every household in the Heilbronn district can register bulky waste free of charge once a year. This includes household items that are too large to fit in the regular garbage can and could be taken away when moving. Normal household quantities of scrap metal and large electrical appliances can also be added. The waste disposal guide for the city of Heilbronn is available here.

The city of Heilbronn also has the Heilbronn waste app, which can be used to quickly and easily display waste collection dates for your own address.

### **Administrative matters**

### **Residence registration**

All citizens of every nationality are obliged to register within a short period of time once they have a fixed residence in Germany. It is important that you bring your ID or passport and a confirmation letter from your landlord ("Wohnungsgeberbestätigung"):

You should repeat this procedure every time you change your place of residence in Germany.

Students from non-EU countries will have to make a second appointment at the immigration office ("Ausländerbehörde") to obtain the residence permit:

For all our new students in Heilbronn, TUM offers exclusive student appointments in cooperation with the Citizens' Registration Office (Einwohnermeldeamt) and the Immigration Office (Ausländerbehörde) in the winter semester. Other deadlines apply to these appointments.

The second appointment can only be made after making the first appointment with TUM, as these are scheduled appointments.

Please make sure to bring the required documents to the appointment.

Students studying in Heilbronn will receive a welcome package from the municipality when they register Heilbronn as their primary residence for the first time. The welcome package includes a voucher from Heilbronn Marketing GmbH, ten free tickets for the indoor or outdoor pool as well as a participation for the annual Raffle of Heilbronn City Bikes.

For all first-year students, the Heilbronn Sports Pass is also issued for a one-year free membership in one of the participating sports clubs. The costs for the membership – a maximum of 75 euros per year – are covered by the city of Heilbronn.

## **Public transportation**

The public transportation network runs buses and suburban trains ("Straßenbahn") in Heilbronn. The same ticket is valid for all forms of public transportation – i.e., you do not need a different ticket if you move from train to bus.

The most common mean of transportation in Heilbronn is biking. The bike paths are well developed and it is easy to get around by bike due to the size of the city. Taxi service is a relatively expensive choice of transportation.

The D-Ticket JugendBW is a ticket for students under 27 years of age, which has the same conditions as the Deutschland-Ticket but at a reduced price. For ca. 365 euros per year or 39.42 euros per month, young people from Baden-Württemberg can use public transport throughout Germany.

For Students aged 27 and older, the monthly 58 € D-Ticket is also available if they wish to travel across Germany.


